We pray for peace in Glasgow and the work of the Police during this time of protests and divisions

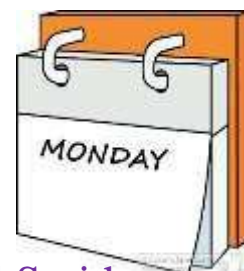
We pray for those named on our pewsheets – for health, healing and wholeness
