Sadly this is a plight for many people in the world today as they seek to find a home and a

place to feel safe and secure.

During my early months of living in Scotland I met many many people in Glasgow fleeing from despotic regimes to build a life in Scotland because they had heard it was a good place to live. Here in Johnstone there are not that many people who are refugees, people seeking to put down roots and feel secure and safe – but there are some. We are reminded in Christmastide that Jesus himself was a refugee – the Holy Family knew what it was to seek a place to live and call home. May we take this to heart as a spiritual lesson to us, that we welcome the stranger and foreigner into our midst: whether in Johnstone, Lochwinnoch, Howwood, Elderslee, Linwood or Kilbarchan and offer the hospitality of welcome that the Lord always offers to us as we come to meet him at the alter week by week. God know what it is like to not fit in, to seek a home and a place to belong. God welcomes you wherever you have come from and may we at St John's do the same that together we build a church of brother & sisters from across the globe.

May you keep the 40 days of the Christmas season with joy and peace in your hearts.
