The Reverse Advent Calendar is one practical idea for marking the days of Advent. Get a box and every day add an item for your nearest foodbank. Remember to get it


to them in early December so that the goods can be distributed in time for Christmas.

An activity to try

Why not tell your neighbours what it is you are waiting for? Put up a picture in your window with a message. You can use the nativity on the next page as a template. Secure it over two pieces of black paper. Cut out the darker areas between the shape and the figures. Then stick some strips of coloured tissue paper on the back to fill the gaps. Attach the other black sheet to the back. Then put it in the



window facing outwards with your message, such as "Watch this space! Or "Worth waiting for!" Don't forget to take a picture of your window and email, What's App or post it to Reuben and we'll put it on our OoF pages.
